

## Mummers Wall of Honor

A campaign has been launched to pay tribute to the men and women, past and present, who have preserved the tradition on mummersy as we know it today. Through their tireless efforts. A tradition that began over 350 years ago and has entertained millions of people, the art and folklore of mummersy has flourished. It is these individuals; not only costumed marcher, but the seamstress, marshall, designer, carpenter, civic leader, and many other individuals who have contributed toward this custom, be permanently enshrined on the Mummers Wall of Honor, as a recognition of their artistry and dedication.

Proceeds will be used to enhance or replace current museum exhibits, which are more than 40 years in age. The Mummers Wall of Honor was unveiled in the spring of 1996.

When you make a \$200 contribution for the enhancement of the exhibit area of the Mummers Museum, the name you designate will be permanently placed on Mummers Wall of Honor in the Hall of Fame Room. You will receive a handsome certificate, personalized with the name and affiliation of the individual you choose to honor.

In addition, all names will be entered together with a biography and the name of the donor, in a computer register.

### Guidelines for registration

- \$200 (one name entry).
- Entry is a maximum of 30 characters including spaces.
- Parentheses or quotation marks are not used.
- Specify upper and lower case letters and spacing where necessary (e.g. van Nye, DiDonato).
- Affiliation does not appear on the Wall – it is listed in a computer database.
- Biography should be 100 words or less and submitted in printer format.
